Collaboration - Advocacy

 Passage of Sports Medicine Licensure Clarity Act in 2018 was great example of sports medicine community coming together on a federal issue

Actionable items:

- Help push for final 4 states to pass state version of Licensure Clarity Act legislation at the state level to clarify exemption for teams traveling into state (HI, KS, NE and OK)
- Advocate for passage of the federal P.H.I.T. Act (which will allow Americans to use pre-tax medical accounts to pay for physical activity expenses)





Collaboration - Advocacy

 Physical Activity Alliance – AMSSM has signed on with ACSM, NATA, APTA, the American Heart Association and 9 other organizations as founding members of this Alliance that will lead efforts to create, support, and advocate policy and system changes to encourage physical activity in the US population.

Actionable items:

- Consider having your organization sign on as a member of the Physical Activity Alliance (\$10,000/year for seat on the Board)
- Consider sending a representative to 2021 AMSSM Research Summit on Physical Activity – April 13, 2021 in San Diego, CA

Youth Sports Strategy

- First official federal roadmap for youth sports by Executive Order, HHS developed
- Unique benefits for health outweigh risks
- But not all youth have the same opportunity, motivation, and access
- Plan has actionable strategies
- Private sector overall and the Joint Commission especially has a key role
- Need to take action at the national, state, and local levels
- And we need to do it NOW, with a sense of urgency!

Healthy People 2030

- Four decades of Healthy People with a vision for health improvement and equity
- Leading health indicators with keen relevance to the Joint Commission (e.g., PA and nutrition, mental health, prevention, injury, and more)
- Mandate to reduce the number of objectives
- Release in Spring 2020
- Again, an opportunity for the Joint Commission organizations to lead and provide transformative national service
